<u>Grime and Punishment</u>	A study of an aspect or theme in British History that extends children's chronological knowledge beyond 1066 Changes in an aspect of social history such as crime and punishment from the Anglo Saxon to the present	
<u>Beowulf</u>	Britain's settlement by Anglo Saxons and Scots Anglo Saxon art and culture	
<u>King of the Cloud Forests (mountains – geography)</u>	Geography focus

<u>Secrets of a Sun King Ancient Egypt</u>	The achievements of the earliest civilisations – an overview of where and when the first civilisations appeared and a depth study of Ancient Egypt	
<u>Who might live in a house like this?</u>	A study over time tracing how several aspects of national history are reflected in the locality (this can go beyond 1066)	
<u>Benin</u>	A non-European society that provides contrasts with British history – Benin (West Africa) c.AD 900-1300	
<u>Song of the Dolphin Boy</u>	Geography focus

<u>Who let the Gods Out?</u>	A study of Greek life and achievements and their influence on the Western World	
<u>Escape from Pompeii and Volcanoes</u>	The Roman Empire and its impact on Britain (look at Romans in Exeter)	
<u>Stig of the Dump</u>	Changes in Britain from the Stone Age to the Iron Age
